The following items have been reviewed and received the following scores, including a “**Cellar Selection**” designation for the **2017 Rudesheimer Ramstein Trocken Riesling**

93 Points **Johannishof** *2017 Rudesheimer Ramstein Trocken Riesling* (Rheingau)

“This dry, full-bodied wine has a density and weight that’s seductive, but it feels a bit tight and closed now. Still, it offers nervy lime zest, lemon and earth characters that should open and yield with time. Hold till 2020, at least—it should reward with great texture and flavor complexity.

91 Points **Johannishof** *2017 Johannisberg “V” Kabinett Riesling* (Rheingau)

“There’s an earthy complexity to this Kabinett, suggesting notes of smoke, dried earth and candle wax melding into brighter tones of tangerine and lemon. Light on its feet and delicately honeyed, it finishes on lingering bolts of lemon and lime acidity. Valckenberg International, Inc”. —A.I.

90 Points **Johannishof** *2017 Johannisberg “S” Kabinett Feinherb Riesling* (Rheingau)

A touch of honey lends delicate sweetness to crisp white grapefruit in this easy-drinking off-dry wine. It’s juicy and fruity but accented by savory notes of earth, dried thyme and lemongrass, too. The finish is moderately long, marked by bitter orange zest and a touch of green herbs. Valckenberg International, Inc.” —A.I.
